Native peoples, the fur clothing industry, organizations such as World Wildlife, Greenpeace and Animal Rights, and the Canadian federal agencies, have had much input into the seal hunting practice.

The comments by Brodie Club members were varied, diverse and philosophical, and did not support any line of action. Lennox remarked that one man's values are another man's irrelevancies. The Speaker was thanked by Aird for a thought-provoking presentation.

Members' Notes and Observations included ones by Lennox, Bodsworth Falls on warblers, by Bodsworth on the mediocre birding on the spring migration at Point Pelee, and by Carrick on matings of the Lesser Canada Goose and the Barnacle Goose, and between Lesser Canada geese.

The annual Brodie Club field outing was held as planned at Gore's Landing. 8 members and 5 guests assembled at the Rectory at the kind invitation of Norm and Norma Martin, enjoyed a picnic lunch and were given a walking tour of historic Gore's Landing and Peters' Woods.
